### Chapter 7: Sarah's Son

Abraham and Sarah are an illustration of Roman's 11:33-12:2. In this lesson they present themselves as living sacrifices as they finally submit to the glorious truth that ***nothing is too hard for God.***

Other points of discussion are: the contrast between a pillar of salt and a pillar of support, our status with God is because of his grace and not our works, the glorious work of the gospel, and evidences of transformation.

Evidently they made him get in line on foot. I will let him go ahead of me - if I ever get to move up front.

I CAN'T WAIT TO GET HOME!

That's pretty much life, isn't it? Hurry up and wait. Start & stop. We get frustrated. Go out, come in. (I did get back home. Ahhh, at last!) Think about your earthly home.

Why do we get that feeling of - what would you call it when you get back home?

-**Safety** (surely that, during these days anyway)?

-**Security** (that is what matters most to women, I have read - but secure in what?)?

-**Freedom** (like being able to let down or let it all out or just to be yourself without the world's eye watching, to do what you want to do or what you ought?)?

-**Gratefulness** (for having a home to return to or for the treasures you have acquired in your home?)? Only God knows our hearts.

These are just a few, but I think for the Christian maybe **Peace** would trump the others. Or perhaps all of these with a righteous perspective, of course, are a part of Peace.

Yes, Jesus spoke of all these in one way or another. Read these verses -

**Safety** - "The beloved of the LORD dwells in safety..." Deut. 33:12

**Security** - "...the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the Hope of glory." Col. 1:27

**Freedom** - "...If you abide in My word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." John 8:31-32

**Gratefulness** - "always give thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father." Eph. 5:20

**Peace** - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." John 14:27

Remember that Jesus told us He was going to prepare a place for us - a home for us in heaven. Indeed, our recently departed beloved sister, Helen Kelley, and beloved brother, Peyton Palmer, now know their own prepared homes, and they are with Jesus! But for us now, Jesus has said "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and **we will come to him and make our home with him.**" (John 14:23) An amazing promise, an amazing fact because Jesus said it!
